COURSE #		OFFICER ALEC IURATO
AM-Mon-003 / PM-Mon-003	CRITICAL INCIDENT DEBRIEF	Bristol Police Department (CT)
This debrief will detail an officer involved shooting resulting in the murder of two officers and the critical injuries of another officer. Officer involved shootings are not pretty by any means. This presentation will discuss the aftermath, lessons learned, requirements of command staff, how to take care of the families of the fallen, and how to maintain positive morale within your department.		

COURSE #	KEEP FIGHTING: OFFICER SURVIVAL & RESILIENCY UNDER PRESSURE	CORPORAL ANDY RODRIGUEZ (Ret.)
AM-MON-006 / PM-MON-006		Orlando Police Department Tac89 Fitness
The course is designed to strengthen officers through building a resilient “don’t quit” mindset; mental toughness under pressure; importance of physical fitness for officer performance and survival; firearms training and preparedness; practical workout and fitness recommendations for officers; performance habits for long-term success; leadership, discipline, and accountability; real-world lessons from patrol, TAC, narcotics detective, and SWAT experience; tools and strategies to help officers navigate post-traumatic stress experiences; and overcoming adversity through the “Keep Fighting” mindset. This course delivers high-impact speaking and training focused on officer survival, resilience, and performance under pressure, led by a former police officer and SWAT operator, who survived a critical on-duty incident. “Building stronger, more resilient officers who perform under pressure and go home safe” is the mission of TAC89.		

COURSE #	LIABILITY REDUCTION THROUGH “DANGEROUS” TRAINING	SGT DAVID K. MEYERS
AM-MON-016 / PM-MON-016		USARMY NG FLARNG(USA)
Legacy and “safe” training continue to dominate LE training in the firearms realm. Special operations teams can fall prey to this as well. LE seems to be overly focused on safety rather than making a safe, cognitively dexterous shooter. This course gives firearms instructors, TL’s, etc., new ways of considering how to train their teams to do their dangerous job safely. Data, videos and tangible training tools will be used in the course. STUDENT REQUIREMENTS: Note taking materials.

AM-MON-015 / PM-MON-015		
This course will identify the goals of <i>Tactical Emergency Casualty Care (TECC) Guidelines</i> as it applies to tactical law enforcement operations. It will address the key factors influencing TECC and will explain the evidence-based medicine that documents the lifesaving impact of TECC use for the non-medical tactical operator, and how it applies to overall tactical law enforcement operations. <u>STUDENT REQUIREMENTS:</u> BDU-style pants; polo or T-shirts; NO WEAPONS.		

COURSE #	TACTICAL TEAM LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT	SERGEANT TONY FERRO Gainesville Police Department Florida Swat Association
AM-MON-005 / PM-MON-005		
This is normally a two-day course discussing the importance of the team leader's role in tactical operations, training events, and administrative functions. The class will discuss topics related to tactics and strategies for tactical operations, civil liability considerations, use of force concerns, planning, equipment needs, as well as national law enforcement trends surrounding tactical operations as a whole. This has been a very well received course taught numerous times across the state by well-respected national instructors and serves as an excellent introduction for all members of tactical teams and particularly that of senior members who may become a TL in the future. It also is a solid refresher course for those already filling the role ensuring your team and actions are on par with national standards and trends.		



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COURSE # AM-MON-012 / PM-MON-012	CQB: HOSTAGE RESCUE AND DELIBERATE CLEARING	BRENT TUCKER Former Green Beret Delta Force Operator Owner - FRCC
This four-hour course will teach officers the principles of both Hostage Rescue CQB and Deliberate Clearing Methods. The deliberate clearing will include the use of a ballistic shield. STUDENT REQUIREMENTS: Training uniform; body armor with loadout; SIMS weapons with (100) rounds of SIMS ammo; and eye protection. It is optional to bring a ballistic shield - if you would like to train with it. NO LIVE FIRE!		

COURSE # AM-MON-008 / PM-MON-008	MECHANICAL BREACHING WORKSHOP	ROBERT COLE Team One Network
The breacher, like all other specialty team members, must be given training that ensures he/she is proficient and therefore successful during actual operations. The primary objective of this program is to provide students with a working knowledge of manual breaching tools and techniques. This course will address manual breaching, power and hydraulic-assisted tools. <u>Outcomes:</u> describe types of doors and windows and their construction; understand strike points and tools for various types of doors; understand break and rake techniques for various window types and equipment; understand the principles of ramming techniques and equipment; understand the principles of prying techniques and equipment; understand the principles of cutting techniques and equipment; and understand the principles of power assisted/hydraulic techniques and equipment. STUDENT REQUIREMENTS: <i>Team One Network will provide breaching doors and a variety of breaching tools. Students are welcome to use their own tools if they want to. Eye and ear protection, as well as gloves, are required!</i>		

COURSE # AM-MON-009 / PM-MON-009	PISTOL MOUNTED OPTICS SKILL BUILDER	DAVE HINKELL / DUNC BAILLIE Sig Sauer Academy
PMO Skill Builder is designed to increase the operator's ability to pick up the dot, improve proficiency and pistol handling skills, while reducing time limits and hit zone size. Will address topics such as grip, stance, head/eye position, drawing, reloads and other performance-based drills. STUDENT REQUIREMENTS: Pistol with optics; proper holster; (400) rounds of ammo; belt; (3) magazines; magazine pouches; note-taking material; eye and ear protection.		



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COURSE # AM-MON-004 / PM-MON-004	QUICK REACTION FORCE (QRF) COMBAT RIFLE	TIM STANLEY / BRAD HUDSON / PETE SOULIS FDLE
QRF training will involve all live fire courses, which include deploying from vehicles, working through crowds and all aspects that a QRF team could face. These will be two to four-person teams that flow together in a common way to stop the threat. There will be a lot of moving targets and challenges that personnel would experience in a mass shooting situation. A very fluid and active course. STUDENT REQUIREMENTS: Students are expected to bring all weapons systems issued to them by their agency with sufficient ammunition to conduct firearms training (full kit – handguns (100 rounds) – long guns (350 rounds); eye protection; ear protection; helmet; entry/heavy vest; and water to stay hydrated.		

COURSE # AM-MON-019 / PM-MON-019	RAPPELLING: LEARNING TECHNIQUES & BUILDING CONFIDENCE FOR SRI TOWER SCRAMBLE	TOM FOSTER (Ret.) Orange County Sheriff's Office JOHN WORSHAM (Ret.) Orlando Police Department The Vertical Option, LLC
This class will provide knowledge and hands-on training that will enhance the student's confidence and skills needed for optimal performance during the rappelling portion of the Tower Scramble event. STUDENT REQUIREMENTS: Rappel harness; rappel gloves; helmet; rescue-eight descender; and (1) carabiner (minimum 27kn). NOTE: ATTENDING STUDENTS ARE ENCOURAGED TO BRING THEIR COMPETITION ROPES FOR INSPECTION, AS WELL AS PROPER PRE-COMPETITION SET-UP.		



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COURSE #	RIFLE SKILL BUILDER	ISAAC LOPEZ / ROB BUONO Sig Sauer
AM-MON-011 / PM-MON-011		
The SWAT Rifle course increases the operator's handling skills with the patrol rifle. Drills are designed to improve the operator's proficiency and handling capabilities using reduced time limits and hit zones. Students will be tested throughout the course using performance-based training drills (i.e., static shooting drills; positional shooting; shooting on the move; reloads and malfunction drills; and transition to pistol). STUDENT REQUIREMENTS: Estimated round count: (400) rifle rounds and (100) handgun rounds; patrol rifle with sling and (3) magazines; duty handgun with (3) magazines minimum; belt mounted holster or duty rig; magazine pouches; sunscreen and bug spray; hydration system; wraparound eyewear (polycarbonate lenses or non-shattering prescription glasses); earmuffs and earplugs; knee pads; and tac vest.		

COURSE #	SPECIAL OPERATIONS COMBATIVES PROGRAM (SOCP)	SERGEANT JOHN KIRKLAND Orange County Sheriff's Office Florida SWAT Association
AM-MON-010 / PM-MON-010		
SOCP (Special Operations Combatives Program) is a realism based, task-specific system designed to bridge the gap between foundational fighting skills and the unique needs of the modern-day assaulter in the CQB environment. SOCP is the designated combatives program for all U.S. Army Special Operations Forces. ERB Codes: (SOCP I: BRT), (SOCP II: FBR) SOCP is now the standard program for fighting in kit and bridging the gap between CQB and combatives. SOCP is currently being implemented at Special Forces Units 1st, 3rd, 5th, 7th, 10th, SWCS; Special Forces Advanced Skills Battalion; 75 Ranger Regiment; Marine RECON; MARSOC; Air Force SERE; Para Rescue and is spreading fast to other Special Units, FBI, ATF, Border Patrol and other Federal and State Law Enforcement, including Orange County Sheriff's Office SWAT, as well as Special Contract Units. SOCP Concepts: *Fighting in Kit with weaponry; *Weapon transition & retention standing or on ground; *360-degree ambush attacks into and over objects; *Fighting multiple assailants solo or as a team; *Compliant and non-compliant cuffing and vehicle extractions; *Force continuum (lethal/less-than-lethal options); and *Technique 'linkage'. STUDENT REQUIREMENTS: BDU-style pants; shirt of choice (dry fit recommended); helmet (nods attachments stripped); flat sole or wrestling shoes; holster or shooter belt is ok; NO WEAPONS (training weapons will be provided); water bottle and snacks.		



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COURSE #	"TRAIN TO WIN THE FIGHT"	MARK WHEELER / RYAN LAROWE Florida Bullet
AM-MON-002 / PM-MON-002		
This course will improve survival shooting skills through enhanced drills from different shooting positions, movement of the gun, and two-in-a-row function drills to improve your speed and accuracy at a subconscious level. Including, but not limited to: PRI (steel instant response, ¼ sec interval) drills and gun movement drills to improve head up/gun up, trigger prep, speed, gun movement, and accuracy (standing and kneeling); two-in-a-row drill function drills; and shooting prone with a handgun. A TOP SHOOTER AWARD IS GIVEN IN EACH SESSION! STUDENT REQUIREMENTS: Proper range attire; handgun with (3) or (4) magazines; holster rig; patrol or comparable vest; ballistic rated/approved eye protection; hearing protection; ballcap; gloves (if you shoot with them); sunscreen; and hydration.		

COURSE #	TACTICAL TRAUMA RESPONSE FOR SWAT OPERATOR	BJ HALL / PETER ROEHRIG / BRIAN ERB Florida SWAT Association
AM-MON-001 / PM-MON-001		
This course will focus on the rescue of a downed officer/civilian and treatment. Students will be trained in advanced rescue techniques that can be used to perform a rescue in a high-risk environment and the treatment to increase the chance of survival of the downed officer/civilian. Students will be trained in an open field rescue, rescue from a vehicle, and rescue from a structure. During the training, we will teach the students how to extract an injured person from the point of injury using drag and carries, as well as other extraction devices (skeds, litters, etc.). STUDENT REQUIREMENTS: Tactical uniform; vest; helmet; gloves and eye protection. NO WEAPONS OR AMMO!		

COURSE #	USE OF TECHNOLOGY IN TACTICAL OPERATIONS	JONATHAN COX / MIKE KLEINFELT Orange County Sheriff's Office
AM-MON-014 / PM-MON-014		
This course will focus on indoor and outdoor drone use during SWAT operations. The course will also incorporate the use of other technology utilized during these missions such as ground robots, listening devices, wall cameras and more. STUDENT REQUIREMENTS: Drone (indoor or outdoor) or robot and charging devices for drone or robot. If you are unable to bring your agency's equipment, the instructors will have their equipment so you will be able to observe the techniques.		



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COURSE #	VEHICLE BASED RIFLE ENGAGEMENTS	TALLY HALL
AM-MON-007 / PM-MON-007		Orlando Police Department Florida SWAT Association
This course is designed to familiarize officers with the ballistic protection a vehicle provides during a gunfight and gain confidence in fixing rifle malfunctions during a lethal engagement. STUDENT REQUIREMENTS: Rifle; (3) rifle magazines; gear to hold (2) rifle magazines; BDU pants; comfortable shirt; (250) rounds of rifle rounds; eye and ear protection; and water to stay hydrated.
